Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

Female Shiba Inu (tattoo #98) has poor dental health. There is thick hard brown tartar covering all of the cheek teeth and most of the surface of canine and front teeth. The gums are thickened where they contact those teeth.

Male Poodle (tattoo #22) The 2 lower middle front teeth are loose and move easily when touched.

Poor dental health can cause pain and discomfort to the animal as well as lead to further health issues. The licensee is required to use appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose and treat diseases and injuries. The licensee is required to have the above mentioned dogs evaluated by a licensed veterinarian for an accurate diagnosis and to establish an effective treatment plan. The licensee must ensure that all dogs receive adequate veterinary care at all times

3.13(b)(2) Repeat

Veterinary care for dogs.

During the inspection, two adult dogs were identified as under medical treatment but there were no records of medications or diet modification being given to the dogs. The facility representative states the treatments are being done but have not written them down.

*Bulldog (tattoo #56) was prescribed Ofloxacin eye drops to be given twice daily for 1 week on 10-March-2023.

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*Bulldog (tattoo #40) was prescribed oral Cephalexin once a day for 10 days for a skin condition. Additionally, this dog is being fed puppy food and karo syrup daily per an approved protocol for weight management.

Failure to keep medical records may interfere with the ability of APHIS officials to determine if the animals are receiving adequate veterinary care.

Dealers must keep copies of medical records that include if a problem is identified (such as diseases, injury, or illness), the date and the description of the problem, examination findings (if any), test results, plan for treatment and care, and treatment procedures performed. The licensee must ensure that all procedures and treatments performed on the dogs including any medical treatments being provided to each dog are documented on a complete medical record containing all required information.
