Housing facilities, general.

There is an outdoor shelter, housing 2 dogs, that has walls with a heavy accumulation of dirt/grime and other organic material. The affected area covers approximately 40 percent of the interior wall area. Cleaning of surfaces in contact with the dogs is necessary to prevent conditions that could lead to potential disease or health risks. Cleaning and sanitization is important to the health and well-being of the animals. All surfaces of housing facilities must be cleaned and sanitized when necessary to satisfy generally accepted husbandry standards and practices. The licensee must ensure that hard surfaces with which the dogs come in contact must be spot cleaned daily and sanitized in accordance with 3.11 (B) of this sub part to prevent accumulation of excreta and reduce disease hazards.

3.4(b)(3)

Outdoor housing facilities.

Several of the outdoor shelters did not have adequate wind/rain breaks at the entrance, affecting at least 20 dogs. Wind and rain breaks are essential to provide the dogs with the ability to stay warm and dry from the affects of the weather. Some of the open shelters had wind/rain breaks but were propped open by the licensee, therefore not allowing them to protect the dogs from the elements. The licensee must provide and ensure that all outdoor shelters have adequate wind and rain breaks at the entrance to help the animals stay dry and warm at all times.

Outdoor housing facilities.

There were several outdoor shelters that did not provide enough bedding, affecting at least 26 dogs. Some of the shelters had some bedding and some had none. The temperature at the time of inspection was measured to be 34 degrees Fahrenheit. When the temperatures drop below 50 degrees Fahrenheit they must be provided with bedding. When the temperatures drop below 35 degrees Fahrenheit they must be provided with additional bedding. Appropriate bedding is essential during the cold temperatures to facilitate the animals ability to stay warm and to prevent cold related issues that could affect the health and well being of the animals. The licensee must provide and ensure that bedding is of adequate amounts to all outdoor shelters when the temperatures drop below 50 degrees Fahrenheit.
