#### Housing facilities, general.

Outdoor enclosure housing dog, Tobias: A shelter door flap has broken off and exposed a square-shaped, metal hinge at the top of the entrance to the shelter structure. The hinge had four sharp pointed ends and was protruding into the shelter entry.

Outdoor enclosure housing dogs, Cleopatra and Wynona Judd: The frame material which surrounds the outer edges of the shelter entrance was in disrepair. The frame is loose and has left an approximately one-inch gap between the frame and the shelter entrance opening at the bottom.

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Sharp or pointed metal edges within the enclosures could result in punctures or laceration wounds to the animals. Gaps or loose openings due the disrepair of shelter framing material may cause entrapment of the animals' legs or other injuries. Housing facilities for dogs must be in good repair, and they must protect the animals from injuries and contain the animals securely. A system of facility repair and maintenance must be in place to ensure the health and well-being of the animals.

## 3.1(c)(2)

#### Housing facilities, general.

Enclosures for dogs, Dakota and Bentley, each had raised wooden platforms which have become excessively worn and chewed exposing raw wood. Surfaces which are excessively worn, chewed or contain unsealed, exposed wood may trap harmful organisms and cannot be properly cleaned and sanitized.

All surfaces must be maintained on a regular basis. Surfaces of housing facilities that cannot be readily cleaned and sanitized must be replaced when worn or soiled.
