Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A bottle of artificial tears located in the cabinet storing medications expired in 2021. The licensee stated that he could not remember when this medication was last used to treat the animals. Expired medications may not be effective in treating disease conditions in animals and their use may be detrimental to animal health. The licensee should use appropriate methods to prevent and treat illness in animals. This was corrected at the time of inspection. Correct by 11-22-23

3.13(b)(2)

Veterinary care for dogs.

Two adult female pomeranians were found to have thinning hair coats and areas of thickened skin with complete hair loss. The licensee stated that the veterinarian had examined the dogs and agreed that it would be appropriate to treat both animals as outlined in the written program of veterinary care. The licensee stated that the dogs had been treated but had no record of when the dogs were treated and what treatment method was used. There was no record of what date the dogs were examined by a veterinarian or what the veterinarian's findings were. Failure to record veterinary examination findings and recommendations and failure to record when treatments are given prevents APHIS officials from determining whether the program of veterinary care is being followed. The treatments performed and the dates that treatments were administered should be recorded and made available for APHIS inspection. Correct by 11-23-23

3.13(b)(3)

Veterinary care for dogs.

The dates of administration is missing for when all adult dogs received a 5 day preventative Panacur treatment. The date that the Panacur treatment was started was recorded but not additional dates for the other 4 days given. Medical records must be complete for APHIS officials to ensure the animals are receiving adequate veterinary care. Dealers, exhibitors, and research facilities must keep copies of medical records for dogs and make the records available for APHIS inspection. These records must include the names of all vaccines and treatments administered and the dates of administration. This was corrected at the time of inspection.
