Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

***The 6 yr old female Dachshund "Fallon"(chip #000010547361) is very thin (BCS 3/9), her vertebrae and ribs are easily palpated with very little fat observed around her abdomen. Fallon has a large accumulation of a gray colored material on her upper and lower teeth on both sides of her mouth, her gums in these areas are reddened and swollen. Allowing accumulations of tartar can interfere with the dogs ability to eat and drink inhibiting proper nutrition and it can cause the development of infections of the gums that may lead to additional illness. Fallon's dental record indicates she was last checked in April 2023 and was to be watched but there is no follow-up exam recorded.

Fallon must be examined and appropriate care provided to protect her health and well-being.

Time and method of identification.

***There is one enclosure housing a female dachshund with seven puppies and another housing a female dachshund with one puppy. There are two enclosures containing a single dachshund puppy each. There is no identification for the puppies provided on the identification boards above the enclosures, cage cards, or by any other means. All puppies require identification as required in this section. If cage cards are used to identify the puppies they must have the puppies individual number, and means of identification such as distinctive colors or markings, sex, etc. The cards must be attached to the front of the enclosure.

Housing facilities, general.

***There are discarded empty bags, spilled food, antifreeze containers, etc dispersed among the bags of dog food.

Accumulations of trash and waste material and chemicals increase the risk of food contamination and the presence of vermin or problems with pest control. The food storage area must be kept free of clutter with items properly stored to
