### 2.40(b)(3) Direct

#### Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

An adult female cocker spaniel (microchip # 933000320864621) was observed with a cloudy cornea in the left eye in enclosure # 10, in room # 5. The third eyelid appeared red and swollen. There was yellow discharge with shavings adhering to the hair around the eye.

An adult female Yorkie (microchip # 933000320543428) was observed with a cloudy cornea in the left eye in enclosure # 5, in room # 5. There was a crusted discharge with shavings adhering to the hair around the eye. The Yorkie was noted to be squinting while the inspector examined her eye. Squinting can be a sign that the eye condition was painful.

There were no recent observations or treatments recorded for these two dogs prior to the inspection on April 16, 2024. APHIS inspector requested during the inspection that the licensee have these two dogs examined by the attending veterinarian. Both dogs were examined by the attending veterinarian on April 17, 2024, and are under treatment.

Inadequate daily observations to identify sick or injured animals can result in conditions becoming worse. Failure of the licensee to identify medical problems in dogs and communicate these to the attending veterinarian can result in prolonged suffering in animals. The licensee must follow all recommendations for treatment by the attending veterinarian. Documentation of examinations and treatments must be maintained for future review by APHIS officials. Correct by April 18, 2024.

#### 3.6(a)(2)

#### Primary enclosures.

An adult male jug (Jack Russell terrier & pug mix) was observed jumping on the tops of partitions and into an adjacent enclosure housing two dogs in room # 4. Dogs jumping and entering other enclosures can cause fights among the other dogs or be injured trying to jump on and over partitions. Licensee must ensure that enclosures are constructed and maintained to keep the dogs contained to prevent injury. Correct by April 22, 2024.

This inspection was conducted with the licensee on April 16, 2024, and the exit interview was conducted with the facility representative on April 18, 2024.
