##### Veterinary care for dogs.

\* The written program of veterinary care is incomplete for five dogs. It does not include a schedule for sampling and treating parasites and other pests (including fleas, worms, coccidia, giardia, and heartworm). The program of veterinary care does not have an identifiable frequency/schedule for the number of dogs that will be tested. Under section B, parasite control program treatment plan for Ectoparasites it states, "Frontline Plus", Blood Parasites it states, "Heart guard" and under Intestinal Parasites it states "Panacur and Heart guard". In addition, dosage rates that would be administered to the dogs or puppies were not recorded. Failure to have a schedule for parasite sampling may cause the animals to not be adequately protected from diseases and parasites. Ectoparasites including fleas, intestinal parasites such as coccidia and giardia, and heartworm, are common causes of disease in dogs and, if left undetected and not properly treated, can lead to serious illness. The written program of veterinary care must address the requirements for adequate veterinary care and include vaccinations and sampling and treatment of parasites and other pests in accordance with a schedule approved by the veterinarian. ##### Veterinary care for dogs.

\* The USDA Program of Veterinary Care form 7002 A was incomplete for five dogs. Under section C "Preventive Care and Treatment Plan" all schedules are recorded as "Check Daily". This is not a complete description of what will be provided to the dogs. When the program of vet care is missing information, it is not considered to be adequate veterinary care. The program of veterinary care must address the preventive care and treatment of all dogs to ensure healthy and unmatted hair coats, properly trimmed nails, clean and healthy eyes, ears, skin, and teeth. These plans are important to maintain the health and well-being of the dogs and must be addressed in the written program of veterinary care signed by the attending veterinarian. Correct by 9/15/24
