Primary enclosures.

There is still a section of exposed landscaping mesh fabric in the outdoor portion of one enclosure. This was observed in a sloped area of the yard, where the gravel was not completely covering the underlying landscape material. The enclosure housed 8 puppies, some of which were observed chewing on the frayed edges of the material. This could cause injury to the puppies if they were to become entangled in the frayed areas. In addition, the puppies could become ill if the material was to be ingested. Primary enclosures must be kept in good repair to protect the animals from injury.

3.10(a)

Direct

Watering

At the time of the inspection, one automatic water nipple was not working and there was no water available for a female with three puppies. When she was given fresh water, she began to drink nonstop for almost two minutes straight. She paused and then again began to drink again. Based on the eagerness for consuming water it is not known when she last had access to water. Dogs must have continuous access to water for their health and well being and this is especially important for nursing mothers. Although a bucket of water was provided at the time of the inspection, the facility must ensure that the dogs have continuous access to water for their health.

3.11(a)

Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control.

The outdoor runs are not being spot cleaned daily and there is an accumulation of feces in the runs. Primary enclosures must be spot cleaned daily, and feces removed to keep the areas clean and to prevent the dogs from becoming soiled.

3.11(b)(2)

Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control.

The stainless-steel water buckets anchored to the wall under the automatic water drinkers are dirty and need to be cleaned. Not only are they holding water not consumed by the dogs, but there is excess fur and dirt in the buckets. These water receptacles need to be cleaned on a routine basis and at least once every two weeks per this regulation for the

3.11(c)

Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control.

Housekeeping around the kennel and primary enclosures need to be addressed. In one empty outdoor run, there is an excess of weeds and grass growth throughout the area. Excess weeds can create breeding and living areas for pests right next to the enclosures. Weeds, grasses, and bushes must be controlled so as to facilitate cleaning of the premises and pest control, and to protect the health and well-being of the animals.
