Veterinary care for dogs.

The complete physical examinations from head to tail on 6 adult dogs by the attending veterinarian has not been completed since 19June2023. Failure to have each dog examined at least once every 12 months may result in delay of treatment and diagnosis for disease, illness, or injury. Correct by ensuring that a complete physical examination from head to tail of each dog by the attending veterinarian is conducted not less than once every 12 months.

Veterinary care for dogs.

The facility is not following the program of veterinary care for vaccinations. The Program of Veterinary Care currently prescribes dogs will be vaccinated for distemper, parvo, and leptospirosis annually and rabies at 1 year and then every 3 years going forward.

Failure to follow the preventative care schedule for vaccinations in the Program of Veterinary Care does not ensure the dogs are receiving appropriate protection against contagious and deadly diseases such as distemper, parvo, leptospirosis, and rabies which can lead to illness and discomfort to the dogs. The facility must follow the vaccination schedule approved by the attending veterinarian in the Program of Veterinary Care to protect the dogs from deadly or contagious diseases.

The facility has not performed the annual heartworm testing or fecal sampling for internal parasites. Medical records show the last samples obtained were in June 2023. The Program of Veterinary Care states heartworm testing and fecal exams will be performed annually with 25% of the kennel being sampled for heartworm and 10% of the kennel being sampled for intestinal parasites. Failure to follow the parasite control program approved by the attending veterinarian may not properly protect the dogs from parasites and may allow illness to go undetected and untreated, which may cause pain and unnecessary discomfort to the dogs. The facility must follow the parasite control testing schedule approved by the attending veterinarian to protect the dogs from parasites and other pests (worms, coccidia, giardia and heartworm) and have the dogs tested annually.
