Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

A 4 year old male cavalier king charles (microchip #900215000964754) had conjunctivitis in both eyes. The licensee had not observed this prior to the inspection.

Conjunctivitis is a sign the dog may have an underlying health issue that may be contagious to other dogs and needs to be treated by the Attending Veterinarian. Not observing the conjunctivitis in a timely manner and reporting it to the Attending Veterinarian doesn't allow for the Attending Veterinarian to be able to properly diagnose and treat the dog accordingly.

The dog must be treated by the Attending Veterinarian. Going forward, the licensee must provide daily observation to all animals to ensure the health and well-being of the dogs.

Records: Dealers and exhibitors.

APHIS Forms 7005 and 7006 were incomplete. 56 adult dogs were missing where they came from and the date of births were also missing for these dogs. None of the dogs have the date acquired. Many of the 7006 records are missing the disposition date.

Not having the 7005 and 7006 forms completely filled out doesn't allow for APHIS officials to be able to track the dogs through the kennel.

APHIS forms 7005 and 7006 need to be completely filled out going forward. All known missing information needs to be added to these forms and the forms should be made available to the APHIS inspector at the next inspection.

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Veterinary care for dogs.

The program of veterinary care doesn't have anything in it for the sampling of dogs for the various fecal parasites or for heartworm. The licensee is also not currently sampling the adult dogs for the various fecal parasites.

Not having a sampling schedule approved by the Attending Veterinarian and not sampling the adult dogs for fecal parasites doesn't ensure the dogs are adequately protected from various diseases and parasites.

The Attending Veterinarian must add a sampling schedule to the program of veterinary care and all adult dogs must be sampled for parasites in accordance with the plan from the Attending Veterinarian. Correct by 12/19/24.

3.13(b)(3)

Veterinary care for dogs.

The licensee is not currently documenting any of the distemper/parvo vaccinations for any of the adult dogs. Not having documentation of all vaccines for all dogs doesn't ensure that the dogs are adequately protected from the diseases that the vaccine is supposed to protect against. The licensee must accurately document all vaccines given to all dogs in a timely manner moving forward. Correct starting on 11/19/24.
