Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

There is one container of a supplement in the kennel that is not suitable for use. The container, a supplement called Vitalise, has an expiration date of 6/2019. The applicant reports the container is filled from a larger container and he forgot to transcribe the expiration date onto the smaller container. When he checked the stock container, he found that it was also expired. Expired or improperly labeled food additives can be dangerous as the efficacy, potency, and freshness cannot be confirmed. If the supplements are spoiled or no longer effective, side effects to the supplement may become a problem. Correct by ensuring that all supplements and food additives are properly labeled and not expired, so the licensee is able to use the appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases. Corrected at the time of the inspection.

3.13(a)(3)

Veterinary care for dogs.

The licensee is not following the Program of Vet Care for vaccinations. Of the 23 adult dogs, 3 are not up to date on all three of the required vaccinations (distemper, parvovirus, and rabies). The current Program of Vet Care prescribes for the vaccinations to be performed yearly.

- Adult female Shih Tzu #8757 has never been vaccinated against rabies. A rabies vaccination is due. The distemper and parvovirus vaccines are current.
- Adult female Shih Tzu #8756 has never been vaccinated against rabies. A rabies vaccination is due. The distemper and parvovirus vaccines are current.
- Adult female Shih Tzu #8759 has never been vaccinated against rabies. A rabies vaccination is due. The distemper and parvovirus vaccines are current.

Rabies is a life-threatening disease and, if contracted, may cause pain, distress, and suffering. It is also important for breeding females to be vaccinated as they will pass immunity to their offspring through their milk. Correct by vaccinating for distemper, parvovirus, and rabies in accordance with a schedule approved by the Attending Veterinarian and vaccine manufacturer recommendations.
