2.40(b)(2)

Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

* The following medication used to treat 13 dogs at the facility have gone past its labeled expiration date. The recorded expiration date on one 500 ml bottle of Vetrimec 1% (Ivermectin) was 06/23. This medication is intermingled with other products that are currently being used at the facility and are therefore ready for use. The usage of expired medical materials such as drugs, fluids, or sutures on regulated animals is not considered to be an acceptable veterinary practice and does not constitute adequate veterinary care. The effectiveness of the dosage level and expected results when expired drugs are administrated to animals could be drastically changed or may not work as anticipated. The expected results cannot be guaranteed and the animals may experience pain, distress due to mistreatment, unrelieved symptoms or unexpected side effects. Failure to properly label medications or other medical products as being expired and storing them with unexpired medical materials could lead to the unintentional use on regulated animals. The licensee must either dispose of all such expired medical drugs and materials or segregate them in an appropriately labeled, physically separate location from non-expired medical drugs and materials. 3.13(a)(3)

Veterinary care for dogs.

* The last recorded date for annual heartworm testing for 13 dogs was done on 11/29/21. Annual heartworm testing is important for the health of the animals. Heartworm testing is done to ensure that there are no active internal parasites. Heartworms are serious parasites that are transmitted by insect bites. The licensee must ensure that all dogs are receiving vaccinations for contagious and/or deadly diseases of dogs (including rabies, parvovirus, and distemper) and sampling and treatment of parasites and other pests (including fleas, worms, coccidia, giardia, and heartworm) in accordance with a schedule approved by the attending veterinarian. Correct by 10/5/23.

3.13(b)(4)

Veterinary care for dogs.

* There was no paperwork to verify when the last fecal float sample examination was completed. Per phone conservation with the attending veterinarian, it was verified that the last fecal float was done on 11/22/22 but no heartworm test had been completed. Medical records of all required tests are necessary to show that the tests have been completed. Copies of the dates and findings/results of all screening, routine, or other required or recommended tests must be maintained by the licensee. The licensee must keep copies of medical records for dogs and make the records available for APHIS inspection. Correct by 10/5/23.
