### 2.40(b)(2)

### Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

The licensee has bird sulfa antibiotics in the kennel and the Attending Veterinarian (AV) has not approved the use of the bird sulfa antibiotics in dogs. Using medications labeled for use in other species is an off label use of the medication that may be inappropriate and detrimental to the health of the dogs. The AV must approve the use of all off label medications before using them on the dogs.

### 2.50(a)(2)

#### Time and method of identification.

Five weaned puppies all under sixteen weeks of age do not have identification numbers listed on the cage card. Lack of identification does not allow for the proper tracking of the puppies. All puppies must be identified by official USDA identification.

### 2.75(a)(1)

#### Records: Dealers and exhibitors.

The Record of Animals on Hand does not disclose all required information. Lack of complete, accurate and up to date records does not allow for the tracking of the animals. The Record of Animals on Hand must be maintained to fully and correctly disclose all required information for every dog at the kennel.

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### Exercise for dogs.

The applicant must document and maintain a written plan for exercise and the Attending Veterinarian must approve the plan.

### Veterinary care for dogs.

The written Program of Veterinary Care (PVC) is not complete. The PVC must include measures for preventative care and treatment to ensure clean and healthy ears. Lack of a complete and approved PVC doesn't ensure that proper veterinary care is being provided. The PVC must address preventative care and treatment for healthy ears.

All items must be in compliance within 2 more inspections or by May 2, 2022 or the applicant will forfeit the licensee fee and must wait 6 months to reapply.
