The facility's Acquisition of Dogs on Hand (Form 7005) shows 42 adult dogs on hand. The inventory count obtained during inspection is 13 adult dogs. The facility representative states that they have not made changes to the 7005 form recently with recent dog dispositions. A correct inventory count is important to maintain for disease traceback, and in cases of theft or loss. Each dealer shall make, keep, and maintain records which fully and correctly disclose each dog purchased or otherwise acquired, owned, held, euthanized, sold, or otherwise disposed of. Correct by maintaining current and accurate inventory on all dogs at the facility.

3.11(b)(2)

Cleaning, sanitization, housekeeping, and pest control.

Several primary enclosures housing 12 adult dogs have an excessive accumulation of hair and brown, dusty organic debris coating the wires on top of the enclosures. Two of the corner enclosures have a heavy buildup of cobwebs above them as well. Accumulation of dirt, hair, debris and cobwebs can serve as a source of disease hazards, which may cause injury or illness to the dogs. Correct by ensuring that primary enclosures be cleaned and sanitized at least once every 2 weeks or as often as needed to prevent accumulation of dirt, debris, food waste, excreta, or other disease hazards. 3.13(a)(1)

Veterinary care for dogs.

The Program of Veterinary Care states the attending veterinarian will complete a site visit every 6 months. The attending veterinarian has not been to the facility since 27-March-2024 and is now overdue for the site visit. Regularly scheduled site visits are essential in determining if all aspects of animal care (nutrition, health, environment, water, and air quality, etc.) are being provided to the dogs. The licensee must have regularly scheduled visits by the attending veterinarian to the facility where animals are kept, to assess and ensure the adequacy of veterinary care and other aspects of animal care and use.

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Veterinary care for dogs.

Six adult dogs did not have an a complete physical examination from head to tail by the attending veterinarian done every 12 months. The dogs not examined were Pomeranian #221, Pugs #165, #296, #282, Maltese #173 and Mini Australian Shepherd #290. These dogs were last examined on 19-September-2023. Failure to have each dog examined at least once every 12 months may result in delay of treatment and diagnosis for disease, illness, or injury. Correct by ensuring that a complete physical examination from head to tail of each dog by the attending veterinarian is conducted not less than once every 12 months.
