PAW PRINTS The bad, ugly and really ugly business of puppy mills

'indi Callison worries many people have no idea what puppy mill dogs go through. Since falling in love with a puppy in a pet store while attending college in 2008, Callison's curiosity about her dog and his parents became a mission to educate others about puppy mills. Her goal is to end the cruelty of puppy mills and the pet stores and online sites that keep them in business and she accomplishes that through the nonprofit she founded, Bailing Out Benji.

She says the Siberian husky she purchased had worms and giardia, both of which require veterinary care. Pet store employees said all puppies have them, but with years of experience since being told this 15 years ago, she knows otherwise. She said her dog, Ozzie, led a remarkably healthy life despite being a mill puppy.

That is certainly not the case for many, if not most, including Callison's recent adoptee, a golden retriever named Eleanor. Truthfully, if you have a weak constitution, do not read the rest of this paragraph because what this sweet dog was put through is not just horrific, it is criminal. The puppy mill breeder, who eventually was charged with crimes by the U.S. Justice Department, had more than 800 dogs, including Eleanor. Eleanor was a puppy mill mama who was artificially inseminated not long after having a litter. Whoever performed the implant sewed the dog back up with fishing line,

not the dissolvable thread used by veterinarians. I've been cut, sliced actually, by fishing line. Not surprisingly, Eleanor developed Pyometra, an infection of the uterus. This preventable infection caused her womb to fill with pus. It can lead to kidney failure, toxemia, dehydration and death. She almost died until the government ordered this despicable individual's facility to close and sell all the dogs he had in his possession. Eleanor was rescued by an organization and Callison was the lucky person who ultimately adopted Eleanor.

It goes without saying that Callison, her supportive volunteers, other rescue organizations and a plethora of newspaper articles about this puppy mill breeder's repeated serious violations contributed to the U.S. Department of Agriculture and U.S Justice Department pursuing their own investigations and bringing criminal charges. His ultimate conviction led to fines and a jail term and, most importantly, saving the 500 dogs he held.

But, here's the thing. This guy is just one of many who should never be able to touch an animal. Ever.

Recently, the Humane Society of the United States recently

published their Horrible 100 list - the list of puppy mill breeders who commit egregious offenses on innocent animals. What's worse? Ohio is - once again near the top with 13 on the list.

Callison, whose organization maintains a database of puppy mills across the U.S., and pet stores that sell them, told me Ohio "owns" another "top place" in being number three in the country for puppy stores selling mill puppies.

I'm not done. Ohio has hundreds of puppy mills. Try to digest that number given that many mill operators have hundreds of dogs. It's huge and the Ohio Department of Agriculture has just a handful of staff to inspect these facilities. That doesn't include those who refuse access, or move around frequently, or sell out of a backyard or barn, known as backyard breeders with no state regulation to ensure they are sanitary and treat animals well by, you know, giving them clean water to drink, decent food everyday and vet care. Are you horrified to know that some breeders believe in "D-I-Y" vet care? Think Eleanor.

Bailing Out Benji now has hundreds of volunteers in 36 states, including Ohio. While the goal is to get dogs out of puppy mills, Callison won't do it with hyperbolic protests or by trash-mouthing a group others may believe are largely responsible for puppy mill problems. Volunteers spend their time educating the public about the dangers of puppy mills for the very puppy they wish to adopt. They attend

community events and, yes, they will gather near stores known to sell mill puppies to distribute literature and talk one-on-one with potential puppy buyers.

There's another group of volunteers who monitor legislative activities that can help protect puppy mill adults and puppies, and still others that help with social media and responses to information requests from members of the public. They also maintain a section on their website about how to identify a good breeder. Callison says it's important to tell the public not everyone who breeds is a puppy mill breeder.


Callsion thinks the tide is slowly turning — and that will help save more dogs from a miserable existence.

"We treat our cats and dogs as kids so that might be why we're seeing a shift in attitude as more and more people see dogs as part of the family," she said.

It seems painfully slow, however, because she knows there are literally thousands of Benji's waiting for someone to release them from a hellish existence and provide them a safe, loving home for the rest of their lives.

If you visit the shelter and don't see the particular animal you are looking for, please ask


Cletus
