Attending veterinarian and adequate veterinary care (dealers and exhibitors).

-An adult male poodle dog (microchip 7467) has severe dental disease. A heavy buildup of thick brown material was seen covering most of the teeth and was worse on the right side. The gums were red and swollen with discharge at the base of the teeth. There was also severe gum recession on the upper right canine tooth. Heavy buildup on the teeth with redness, swelling and discharge can be signs of dental problems and can cause infection, pain, and discomfort to the animal.

-An adult female Bernese Mountain dog (microchip 9738) has severe dental disease. A heavy buildup of thick brown hard material was seen on a large portion of the teeth with the most significant buildup being on the upper canine teeth. The gums around these teeth were red and swollen. Heavy buildup on the teeth with redness and swelling can be signs of dental problems and can cause infection, pain, and discomfort to the animal.

-An adult female Bernese Mountain dog (microchip 9738) had matting near the ears, chest and on the left side of the abdomen. The matt on left side of the abdomen contained fecal material. Hair matting causes discomfort and can lead to sores and infections in dogs when not treated appropriately.

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-An adult female Bernese Mountain dog (microchip 7952) had matting near the ears and neck. Hair matting causes discomfort and can lead to sores and infections in dogs when not treated appropriately.

Failure to provide veterinary care when needed can result in prolonged suffering and worsening of the condition of the animal. Licensees must ensure that they establish and maintain programs of adequate veterinary care, including the use appropriate methods to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases and injuries. When animals are identified with injuries or illness, they must seek care by their veterinarian to prevent, control, diagnose, and treat diseases. Correct by ensuring that the animals listed above are examined and treated by a licensed veterinarian, also ensure all animals are provided with adequate veterinary care. Correct by 07 April 2023.

3.1(c)(2)

Housing facilities, general.

The primary enclosures contain carpets that are in disrepair and have frayed edges. Four enclosures housing adult females with litters have carpets that are torn and damaged. Frayed edges can be injurious to the regulated animal as they could ingest the material or could cause entrapment. All surfaces must be maintained on a regular basis. Surfaces of housing facilities—including houses, dens, and other furniture-type fixtures and objects within the facility—that cannot be readily cleaned and sanitized, must be replaced when worn or soiled. The carpets must be maintained without frayed edges.

This is a 1st Re-License Inspection for a Class “A” license. The inspection and exit briefing were conducted with the applicant.

All items must be in compliance within 2 more inspections or by 05 June 2023 or the applicant will forfeit the license fee

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and must wait 6 months to reapply. Please contact your inspector to schedule your next Re-License Inspection.

Regulated activity can continue under your existing USDA license until it expires.
